Healthy Life Years In the core of the Lisbon Strategy (1)

- In 2004, the European Council re-launched the Lisbon strategic Goals (2000-2010) - focus on employment, economic reform and social cohesion as part of a knowledge-based economy
- Structural Indicators have been developed to support objective assessment of progress towards the goals
- To monitor health as an economic and societal welfare factor, the Healthy Life Years (HLY) indicator was developed
- HLY is a DFLE based on a global activity limitation question:

For the past six months at least, to what extent have you been limited because of a health problem in activities people usually do?

Severely limited / limited but not severely / no limited

Healthy Life Years In the core of the Lisbon Strategy (2)

The Structural indicators (2000)

- 1. GDP per capita
- 2. Labour productivity per person employed
- 3. Employment rate (total, females, males)
- 4. Employment rate of older workers (total, females, males)
- 5. Gross domestic expenditure on R&D
- 6. Youth education attainment level (total, females, males)
- 7. Comparative price levels
- 8. Business investment
- 9. At-risk-of-poverty rate after social transfers (total, females, males)
- 10. Dispersion of regional employment rates (total, females, males)
- 11. Long-term unemployed rate (total, females, males)
- 12. Total greenhouse gas emissions
- 13. Energy intensity of the economy
- 14. Volume of freight transport relative to GDP

In 2003 the Healthy Life Years (HLY), also called disability-free life expectancy (total, females, males) was added to this first list with a few other indicators

SILC

To be able to provide HLY estimates for the 25 EU member States, Eurostat included in **EU-SILC** (EU Statistics on Income and Living Conditions survey, successor of the European Community Household Panel, ECHP 1995-2001), the **Mini European Health Module (MEHM)** developed by Euro-REVES (Euro-Reves II project).

Pilots were done in 2003 and SILC was launched in 2004 in 13 MS and in 2005 in all 25 MS. Thus SILC provides the data for HLY estimates to be annually computed by Eurostat for all MS from 2005.



The European Health Interview Survey (EHIS) will the basic survey of the European Health Survey System (EHSS). The first round of the EHIS could take place in 2008/2009 according to the Members States.

The survey system might take various forms in the different countries, but in all Member States the common elements will be: **the annual Mini European Health Module (MEHM),** this would be the annual component of the survey system, providing the data needed annually for the European Structural Indicators in the field of health (HLY) as well as other modules such as a European Module on Health Status (EMHS), a European Survey Module on Determinants of Health (ESMD) and a European Survey Module on Care (ESMC).

Run every 5 year, EHIS will allow the validation/calibration of the annual data provided by **SILC**



The **EURO-Reves I** (1995-1997) & **II** (1997-2002) projects provided the scientific background leading to the choice of a disability-free life expectancy as the main health indicator in the European Union.



Stages of the Euro-REVES approach

- Stage 1 (1995-1997): Identifying reasons for the incomparability of health expectancy calculations in Europe (Euro-REVES I)
- Stage 2 (1997-2002): Selection of a coherent set of health indicators for the European Union (Euro-REVES II)
- Stage 3 (2002-2003): Development of the European Health Status Module (EHSM) for health and social surveys
- Stage 4 (2004-2007): The European Health Expectancy Monitoring Unit (EHEMU)
- Stage 5 (2007-2010): The European Health and Life Expectancy Information System (EHLEIS)





Today Euro-REVES provides continuous scientific support through the monitoring projects:

- **EHEMU**: European Health Expectancy Monitoring Unit, 2004-2007
- EHLEIS: European Health and Life Expectancy Information System, 2007-2010

Euro-REVES coordinates the **European Task Force on Health Expectancies** which gathers every 6 months MS with the Commission and EHEMU team


