
Contains questions regarding:

Self-perceived health -> life expectancy in good selfpreceived health


Functional limitations -> life expectancy without disabilities

Chronic diseases -> life expectancy without chronic diseases


Life Expectancy bij income for men




Life Expectancy by income for women

Dicussion points

- Similar results for income and education
- Which indicator? Income or education?

Income: - takes into account total household

- less problematic in use with children
- available for all people in population register

Future: excluding subjects with main income from invalidity/sickness benefit



Discussion points (2)

Education:

- Closely related to long-term economic position (Smith & Kingston, 1997)
- Stable over time
- Less susceptible to reverse causation
- Less problematic in use with older people
- Widely used in health inequality research
